#### Winter Lecture series 2019/20

Friday 11<sup>th</sup> October 2019 "From the BBC to the C OF E."

Rev. Mark Lowther - Rector Alde Sandlings Benefice.

After training at Trinity College of Music, Mark was 30 years at the BBC finally becoming Senior Music Producer at Radio 3 (when The Controller of Radio 3 was called Roger!). Mark's church involvement took him from village organist to ordained priest in a rural parish and via two prominent London churches to Rector of the Alde Benefice. He will reflect on the place of institutions such as the BBC and the C of E. in 21st Century British life at a time of huge pressures on both. Having spent almost 40 years living with constant change he remains optimistic!
