**Friday 12<sup>th</sup> October 2018 –**

**THE LIVING LANDSCAPE.**

**Michael Strand Development Director – Suffolk Wildlife Trust.**

Suffolk Wildlife Trust currently cares for nearly eight thousand acres of some of the county's most inspiring wild places. Their conservation advisers work with farmers and local communities to improve the land for wildlife and secure a future for some of Suffolk's most threatened species. Nationally significant infrastructure projects are proposed for development either in Suffolk or off the coast. Michael Strand will talk about the trust's plans and how it hopes to preserve and protect the environment in testing times.
